ABOUT THE GOG AWARDS

Established in 1977, the GOG Awards were made to highlight the continued excellence, innovation, and importance of the public art galleries, art museums, art centres, and art organizations in Ontario. Now in its 45th edition, the GOG Awards is the most credited awards program of any arts service organization, and is one of our most important and signature events. The GOG Awards continue to be instrumental in educating the pubic about the importance of Ontario's public art galleries as essential cultural resources and institutions.

This year GOG received 74 nominations from 22 art galleries across 17 cities throughout the province. GOG members are eligible to submit nominations for the GOG Awards. These nominations are assessed by a jury of their peers with no organizations or individual nominations in competition for the 2022 GOG Awards. The GOG Awards acknowledges both institutions and individuals and recognizes artistic merit, excellence, and outstanding achievement in all 29 categories. This is the first year since the pandemic that GOG is acknowledging all award categories.

Public art galleries and art museums are an integral part of Canada's visual arts sector and hold a key role in Canada's economy; every year 99% of Canadians participate in arts, culture, and heritage in some way. Now more than ever, our cultural sector needs to be celebrated and honoured.

In 2022, the GOG Awards continue to be instrumental in educating the public about the importance of Ontario's public art galleries as essential cultural resources and institutions.

Design – all highly respected peers in our field. The jurors reviewed 74 nominations from 22 member organizations, coming from 17 municipalities in Ontario: Barrie, Hamilton, Kingston, Kitchener, London, Markham, Mississauga, Niagara, Oakville, Oshawa, Ottawa, Peterborough, Owen Sound, Thunder Bay, Toronto, Waterloo, and Windsor.

The jurors awarded 29 awards, 22 of which are being awarded during the GOG Awards Ceremony on November 28 at the Hot Docs Ted Rogers Cinema. These include four Exhibition of the Year awards (for budgets over \$50,000, over \$20,000, under \$20,000, and under \$10,000), a Public Program Award, Lifetime Achievement Award, Changemaker BIPOC Award, and awards to celebrate excellence in curating, education, writing, publishing, design, and others.

On behalf of the Galeries Ontario Galleries, we congratulate the 2022 Award recipients. We thank all members for their submissions, as well as the many individuals whose work has supported the nominated and awardwinning projects and initiatives celebrated tonight. Thank you to the visionary Zainub Verjee and her phenomenal staff at GOG for their unwavering commitment to this signature annual program, and for the incredible work they accomplish for, and on behalf of the visual arts sector.

Galeries Ontario / Ontario Galleries (GOG) was founded in 1968 as a means to offer a collective voice for public art galleries in Ontario. The 11 founding members wanted to encourage a closer cooperation and understanding between funders and art galleries in order to assist the development of the visual arts sector in the province. Apart from serving as an advisory body in matters of professional interest, one of GOG's key objectives was to promote high standards of excellence and uniform methods in the care and presentation of works of art. GOG incorporated as a non-profit organization in 1970 when the secretariat office opened in Toronto.

GOG fosters a sustainable, healthy, diverse, public art gallery sector to further the visual arts as a key component of the cultural life of the province. We serve communities in every region and our membership is diverse. From rural institutions in North Bay, to large institutions in Toronto, we serve Ontario public art galleries through our three pillars of service: advocacy, professional development, and network-building. GOG runs numerous professional development workshops throughout the year and in the past has developed art symposiums, mentorship programs and is one of the founders of the Provincial Arts Service Organization, a bilingual coalition to promote and advocate arts and culture in Ontario



2022 GOG AWARDS

This year, the program catalogue presents the Winners and the Shortlisted nominees for each award. All winners were announced live during the Awards ceremony on November 28, 2022. The Winners are listed first in each category, then followed by the shortlisted nominees, first to second runner up.

AWARDS CATEGORIES

Exhibition Awards

Recognizing exceptional and original curatorial and artistic achievement, supported by technical excellence in exhibition design and installation. This includes exhibitions presented online.

Public Program Award

Recognizing other remarkable and innovative curatorial programs originated and developed by staff or contract employees or teams for a public audience. This Award specifically acknowledges the development of the public program as it embraces a curatorial model, that is, a model based on curatorial research and development producing new artistic opportunities for critical exchange between gallery, artist, and community. The nominated event, performance, screening, lecture or other form of public engagement does not need to be directly associated with an exhibition. but illustrates excellence in audience and artistic achievement. The program/project can take place online, outside of the gallery or be part of an ongoing series.

Education Award

Recognizing remarkable and innovative art educational programs. Galleries carefully design and deliver unique educational programs, opportunities and experiences for broadly diverse audiences that are intended to stimulate and broaden interest, enjoyment and understanding of art.

Changemaker BIPOC Award

The Changemaker BIPOC Award recognizes arts leaders, who identify as Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour, for their distinctive and outstanding contributions to the BIPOC communities and public art gallery sector of Ontario. The award will be presented annually to recognize individual changemakers and member institutions who champion voices from distinct social and political contexts, and who have unique relationships with the land. The award recognizes the nominee's role as an advocate within their own institution to change policies and procedures that address social equity and anti-oppression in current institutional systems. The aim of this Award is to strengthen networks and foster a vital and resilient BIPOC arts and institutional ecosystem, beginning with our GOG members.

Colleague Award

Recognizing extraordinary achievement by professional colleagues working in and with their gallery. This award is open to all those who are not directors, curators, public programmers or educators. Gallery Directors are encouraged to nominate their peers for extraordinary achievement working in the areas of administration, fundraising, marketing, communications, security, and facilities management.

Volunteer Award

Recognizing a volunteer who has significantly enhanced the gallery's core activities, demonstrating an extraordinary sustained voluntary contribution that has made a concrete difference for the nominating gallery.

Key Partnership Award

These external nominees will have provided remarkable sustained financial support through an annual donation or key sponsorship of an exhibition or innovative program, donation of key materials to your library or collection, or an extraordinary contribution significantly enhancing your organization's capacity to reach into the community or deliver new programs to new audiences.

Lifetime Achievement Award

The Lifetime Achievement is an award of artistic merit and professional service to the field and is presented to the nominated individual. It celebrates significant moments of extraordinary annual artistic activity or career achievement. This is a certificate Award distinguishing an individual living Designated Representative, or Colleague member of GOG who has provided a sustained and extraordinary professional contribution to the Ontario public art gallery community over at least 25 years of active service.

Curatorial Writing Awards

Recognizing original texts about visual art written by Canadian art gallery curators, guest curators or guest writers. Commissioned and published as curatorial writing in relation to an exhibited artwork or a visual art exhibition, contemporary or historical.

Art Writing Award

Recognizing other original commissioned art writing published in relation to exhibitions, activities, or programs. Nominations can include art texts by educators, artists, or critical writers that may not fall naturally within the Curatorial Writing Awards. The writer does not have to be a curator or Canadian.



Art Publication Award

Recognizing extraordinary visual art book, video, film, or website projects.

Design Awards

Recognizing the highest standards of excellence and achievement in graphic design and material execution for printed or published materials. The GOG Design Awards were the first to be instituted and are an integral component of the GOG Awards.
